

Terms and conditions for the use of Swisstopo geodata by members of ETH Zurich

1 General

Analogue and digital geodata from Swisstopo may only be used for teaching and research purposes within the ETH domain (**ETH Zurich, ETH Lausanne, WSL, PSI, EAWAG, EMPA**). The original data must be deleted after the research project has been completed.

2 Transfer to third parties

Geodata and geodetic products **may not be transferred to third parties** outside the ETH domain. In the case of research projects conducted in collaboration with other universities and institutes outside the ETH domain, the institutions of the ETH domain must obtain authorisation from Swisstopo.

3 Conditions of reproduction

Analogue reproduction: Size of extract: A7-A3 (full scale), 1:1, enlarged or reduced, monochrome or polychrome

Digital reproduction: Size of extract: 2 million pixels, A7-A3 (full scale), static images or PDFs only, publication within the domain ethz.ch only, printouts from website for personal use only

4 Citing the source and authorisation

Analogue reproduction: **Reproduced with the authorisation of swisstopo (JA100120)**

Digital reproduction: © **2016 swisstopo (JD100042)**

5 Specimen copy

A specimen copy of each publication must be sent to Swisstopo by the end of the current year, or within three months in the case of research reports relating to the quality and use of Swisstopo geodata.

6 Publications with special authorisation

Special written authorisation from Swisstopo is required in the following cases:

- Publications of Swisstopo products in direct or derived graphical analogue form, or parts or derivatives thereof, if more than 500 copies are issued for solely scientific publications.
- Direct digitalisations (vectorisations) of map contents, or parts thereof, which are not to be used purely for teaching or research purposes.
- Publications of products or services on the Internet.

7 Additional conditions

The conditions of the ordinances of the Federal Council on geoinformation and on the national survey from 21 May 2008 (SR 510.620 and SR 510.626) also apply.
